- For Pre-K through 6th grade students with developmental delays.
- Field trips may be scheduled.
- Open to students eligible for Extended School Year (ESY) services per IEP (at no cost to these students).
- Students may attend full or part time.
- Transportation provided *upon request*.

Special Education Tutoring Program June 1-June 30, 8:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. at Mill Creek Elementary School

- Program focuses on reading & math per IEP goals.
- For 1st through 6th grade students with IEPs.
- Open to students eligible for Extended School Year (ESY) services per IEP (at no cost to these students).
- Students may attend full or part time.
- Transportation provided *upon request*.
- Questions should be directed to your child's special education teacher.

Developmental Program II June 1-June 30, 8:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. at James Clemens High School

- Curriculum includes academics, functional living skills, pre-vocation, & technology.
- For 7th through 12th grade students with developmental delays.
- Open to students eligible for Extended School Year (ESY) services per IEP (at no cost to these students).
- Students may attend full or part time.
- Field trips/work sites may be scheduled.
- Transportation provided *upon request*.
- Questions should be directed to your child's special education teacher.

English Learners Summer Programs

EL Summer Program for Pre-K 4 year olds, K, 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Grade June 1-June 30, 8:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. at Madison Elementary School

- Designed to overcome EL summer learning loss.
- Focused on language acquisition, experiential learning, and STEM activities delivered by certified teachers.
- Transportation *provided upon request*.
- Open to EL students with academic and language needs at no cost.
- Classes will be scheduled Monday-Friday.
- Students must be age 4 by April 1, 2017, entering kindergarten, 1st grade, 2nd grade, or 3rd grade in the fall of the 2017-2018 school year.

EL SAIL Summer Program for 4th, 5th, and 6th Grade June 1-June 30, 8:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. at Madison Elementary School

- Designed to overcome EL summer learning loss through structured summer learning experiences.
- Focused on guided reading, math, language, experiential learning, and STEM activities delivered by certified teachers.
- STAR pre-and post-test will be used to measure progress.
- Transportation *provided upon request*.
- Classes will be scheduled Monday-Friday.
- The program is open at no cost to EL students with academic and language needs entering grades 4-6. EL students with academic and language needs who completed 6th grade in 2016-2017 may also be considered for this program.

Registration for all EL summer programs will be open April 24th - May 5th. Application will be available on the Madison City Schools website or at each elementary school.
