- STAR pre-and post-test used to measure progress.
- Transportation *provided upon request*.
- Classes will be scheduled Monday-Friday.
- The program is open at no cost to EL Madison City Schools students with academic and language needs entering grades K-7 .
- Program mission is to transform the academic achievements, self confidence and life trajectories of the EL students with academic and language needs.

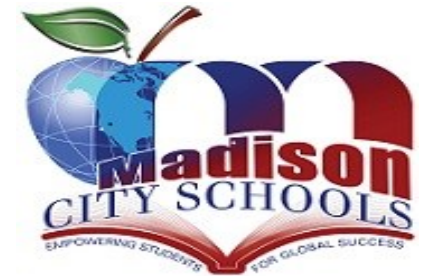

- For Madison City students, registration is April 30—May 4, from 8:30 a.m.-2:00 p.m.
- For Madison City residents, registration is May 3—4, from 8:30 a.m.-2:00 p.m.
- For students in other districts, registration is May 3—4, from 8:30 a.m.-2:00 p.m.
- Late registration for all students is May 22-25, from 8:30 a.m.-2:00 p.m.
- Classes are scheduled from Monday through Friday.
- The cost of a full credit class is \$275.00 for Madison City students & \$325.00 for out-of-district students. The cost for Drivers' Ed., Health, and other 1/2 credit courses is \$200.00 for Madison City students & \$225.00 for out-of-district students. Extra fees will be charged for late registration & lab fees for Science.
- Late registration fee is \$50.00.
- Registration is held at the high school.
- Students who wish to park on campus must pay a \$10.00 parking fee.
